12. New Business

- A. An Amendment to the Land Use Map of the 2040 Comprehensive Plan Re-Guiding Multiple Properties to Medium Density Residential

Community Development Director Ben Boike presented; proposed amendment will re-guide high density townhomes/condos to medium density. Staff recommends approval of this amendment.

Motion was made by Councilmember Justen and seconded by Councilmember Berry to approve the amendment to the 2040 Comprehensive Plan and Future Land Use map to re-guide multiple properties to medium density residential (MDR) and approve Resolution 23-017 Approving the Submittal of an Amendment to the 2040 Comprehensive Plan to Metropolitan Council.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

- B. First Reading – Ordinance Rezoning Multiple Properties to R3 - Townhome Residential

Community Development Director Ben Boike presented the first reading of an ordinance amendment to rezone multiple properties from R2 – Two Family Residential and R4 – Multiple Family Residential to R3 – Townhome Residential. Public hearing and final reading will be at the next meeting. Planning Commission reviewed and held a public hearing at their February 21st meeting. The Commission voted 8-0 to recommend approval of this amendment. Staff recommends approval of the first reading.

Motion was made by Councilmember Justen and seconded by Councilmember Eastman to approve first reading as presented.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

- C. An Ordinance Amending the City Code Regarding Stormwater Management

City Engineer Ross Beckwith presented the first reading of an ordinance amendment repealing sections 153.470 – 153.480 and enacting chapter 154 of the city code regarding stormwater management. Planning Commission reviewed and held a public hearing at their February 21st meeting. The Commission voted 8-0 to recommend approval of this amendment. Staff recommends approval of the first reading and set a public hearing and second reading for March 13, 2023.

Motion was made by Councilmember Eastman and seconded by Councilmember Gulley to approve first reading as presented.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

D. First Reading – Ordinance Amending the Zoning Code Regarding Intoxicating THC

Community Development Director Ben Boike presented the first reading of an ordinance amending section 153.156 of the zoning code regarding intoxicating THC retailers. Planning Commission reviewed and held a public hearing at their February 21st meeting. The Commission voted 7-1 (Dahlquist as the nay vote) to recommend approval of this amendment. Staff recommends council review and approve the first reading of the amendment to city code section 153.156 regarding intoxicating THC retailers.

Motion was made by Councilmember Eng-Sarne and seconded by Councilmember Eastman to approve first reading as presented.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

E. First Reading – Ordinance Amending the Licensing Code Regarding Intoxicating THC

City Manager Nate Burkett presented the first reading. Specialty licenses allowed in B3 and B4, regular license also allowed in B2. Regular license requires 10% or less of retail space dedicated to THC products. Staff recommends council approve the first reading and adoption of an ordinance modifying City Code Chapter 114 - Intoxicating THC Products license and set a public hearing and second reading for March 13, 2023.

Councilmember Justen suggests striking line (L) Intoxicating THC products cannot be sold at exclusive liquor stores from Section 114.04 Performance Standards. With Council discussion and the understanding that State guidance may amend all or part of this ordinance, councilmembers agree to this amendment.

Motion was made by Councilmember Eastman and seconded by Councilmember Justen to approve first reading with the amendment to section 114.04 as presented and outlined herein.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

13. Old Business

- A. Final Reading – Ordinance Amending Ordinance 18-04 - Rezoning 110 Crusader Ave W., 1962 Stryker Ave and 1990 Stryker Ave to PRD, Planned Residential Development with Various Underlying Zoning

Community Development Director Ben Boike presented the final reading of an ordinance amendment which provides an extension on the continued use of 1924 Bidwell to allow continued occupancy of up to 10 non-related occupants and maintain tax exempt status until December 31, 2024.

Motion was made by Councilmember Berry and seconded by Councilmember Eng-Sarne to approve Ordinance 23-002 Ordinance Amending Ordinance 18-04 – Rezoning 110 Crusader Ave W., 1962 Stryker Ave and 1990 Stryker Ave to PRD, Planned Residential Development with Various Underlying Zoning as presented.

Vote: 6 ayes / 0 nays. Motion carried.

14. Adjourn

Prior to adjournment, Mayor Napier asks staff to include an agenda item on a future Open Council Work Session to revisit the Smith-Dodd overlay and related business expansion in that area.

Motion was made by Councilmember Eng-Sarne and seconded by Councilmember Berry to adjourn the meeting at 7:18 p.m.
